

SOUTHSIDE ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE

General Single-Phase Service Schedule GSS

Availability:

Available in all territory served by the Cooperative, subject to the Terms and Conditions of the Cooperative on file with the Virginia State Corporation Commission.

Applicability:

Applicable to Members of the Cooperative for single-phase service to commercial or business organizations, multi-family dwellings, and community halls.

Character of Service:

Single-phase, 60 cycles, at a nominal secondary voltage of 120/240 volts.

Monthly Rate:

I. Distribution Delivery Service Charges

Consumer Delivery Charge: @ \$26.00 per month

Demand Delivery Charge:
All kW Delivered @ \$0.10 per kW

Energy Delivery Charges:
First 100 kWh delivered @ \$0.04730 per kWh
Over 100 kWh delivered @ \$0.03670 per kWh

II. Energy Supply Service Charges:

All kWh sold June - September @ \$0.07642 per kWh
All kWh sold October - May @ \$0.06717 per kWh

Each kWh sold is also subject to a charge or credit under provisions of the Cooperative's Power Cost Adjustment clause, Schedule PCA-1.

Note: The above Delivery Service and Energy Supply Service charges apply to those Members who have the Cooperative as their energy service provider. Only the Distribution Delivery Service charges apply to those Members who have an Electricity Supplier other than the Cooperative as their energy provider.

Billing Demand:

The billing demand shall be the maximum kilowatt integrated demand established by the Member for any 60-minute clock hour period during the month for which the bill is rendered as indicated or recorded by a meter.

Minimum Monthly Distribution Delivery Charge:

The minimum monthly charge for distribution delivery service under this schedule shall be the Consumer Delivery Charge where 15 kVA or less of transformer capacity is required. For Members requiring in excess of 15 kVA of transformer capacity, the minimum monthly charge shall be increased by \$1.00 per each kVA in excess of 15 kVA.

Special Terms & Conditions:

- a) Motors having a rated capacity in excess of 10 horsepower will only be permitted on single-phase service upon approval of the Cooperative. The Cooperative reserves the right to reject the use of motors exceeding 10 horsepower upon finding such installations would interfere with the quality of service rendered to other Members of the Cooperative.
- b) The Cooperative reserves the right to refuse service where the capacity of the Member's load justifies three-phase service on an economic basis.
